Graduation season is here...and so is PCS season!

From Kindergarten through 12th grade, the average military child will attend six to nine different school systems. This can prove to be a challenge for the students as much as the parents. Move after move everyone needs to relearn the education, medical, extracurricular system of every duty station. If you add any kind of special need, whether it be something small like a dairy intolerance or something more serious like a 504 accommodation, your transition to a new duty station can become tough before you even arrive. Here are some resources that can smooth your upcoming transition!



The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children was created to ease many of the problems students in military families face as a result of deployment and transfers between school systems when they relocate with the military by standardizing policies in the school districts of all 50 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity, or DODEA. The compact is governed by the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission. The Compact does not apply to private or international schools.

It's no secret that relocation is a big part of military life. Some families move a few hours away from home, others across the country and some across the globe. Whether you're moving to a state with a year-round school system or are coming from a four-day school week or attending a DODEA school for the first time, we want you to have the resources for a successful transition. Before your move, it's important that you alert your current school and medical provider at least 30 days before your move to request a hard copy of your child's records. Hand carrying these documents is recommended. Notifying your school liaison officer (SLO) saves you some legwork and helps focus your educational options. Every installation has school liaisons who work with military students, educators who service military students, and community partners within the pre-K-12 education realm. School liaisons understand the military experience and can help with:

- Transition support. (including school districts and boundaries)
- Alternative school options and programs. (including private, parochial, charter and home school)
- Special education support and much more.
