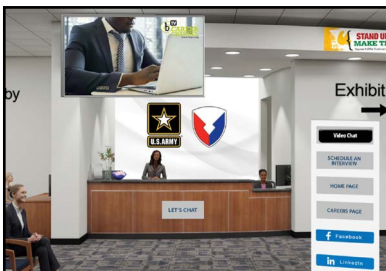
Fort Campbell, Lendlease break ground on housing project

FORT KNOX, Ky. – Fort Campbell and Lendlease kicked off a large-scale housing development project March 4 with a groundbreaking for Erevia Park, a 144-unit community for junior enlisted Soldiers. This project is part of an \$87.4 million development plan that includes funding for new construction, major renovations to New Hammond Heights homes and demolition of outdated homes in LaPointe Village over the next five years. The groundbreaking celebrates significant progress made in the Army's housing investment plan.

The project will include the biggest modernization of the museum in over 50 years. “The renovations will refocus the exhibits on the history of the U.S. Army’s organic industrial base, Rock Island Arsenal, and the Arsenal’s current role in producing Army readiness,” said Patrick Allie, Rock Island Arsenal Museum director.
