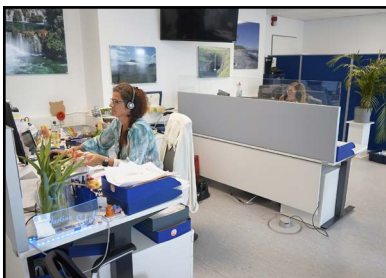
ASC bids farewell to one CG, welcomes another

Medical logistics ensures readiness in Europe

DULMEN, Germany. – A small team of four from U.S. Army Medical Materiel Agency stationed at the Army Prepositioned Stock site in Germany, known as APS-2, worked overtime to provide medical materiel readiness in support of the European response mission, stemming from the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, along with the Defender-Europe 2022 exercise. Overall, USAMMA medical maintainers completed over 2,700 technical inspections, scheduled services and repairs on medical devices, in addition to inventory and receipt of retrograded equipment.



Garrison modernizes maintenance request process

WIESBADEN, Germany – The Army has rolled out the next phase of their Army Maintenance App, or ArMA – the tool for submitting all demand maintenance orders for repair and maintenance. As of May 2022, ArMA is now "fence-to-fence" and is available to all tenants, buildings and assets in the U. S. Army Garrison Wiesbaden footprint. The all-new mobile-friendly website is enabling Soldiers, family members, civilians and contractors to submit online service orders conveniently from their desktop or mobile devices.



AMCOM celebrates anniversary, historian reflects on legacy

REDSTONE ARSENAL, Ala. – The U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command workforce will mark the 25th anniversary of the command's establishment with a weeklong celebration, July 18-22. AMCOM was officially activated July 17, 1997, with the merging of the Aviation and Troop Support Command and the Missile Command. The merger recommendation was based on the Army's need to consolidate missions, as well as Redstone Arsenal's long history with propellants.

Under Secretary of the Army visit focuses on people

Together with Erin Williams, spouse of U.S. Army Europe and Africa's Commanding General, Gen. Darryl Williams the party received a two-day tour of garrison service offices and organizations. They talked about life in a small satellite community and some of the challenges the families face about three hours away from a full service garrison.



Fort Lee celebrates reopening of newly renovated homes

FORT LEE, Va. – A ribbon-cutting marked the return of 40 newly renovated homes to the Fort Lee's privatized family housing inventory. Phase one completion of the Harrison Villa project is the latest step forward in a two-year, \$27 million effort to bring the oldest military family homes up to modern standards with upgraded amenities and lower maintenance costs.

FEVS provides avenue to leadership, drives workplace change

It's called the Office of Personnel Management Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey, better known as FEVS.

CCAD leverages Digital Twin Scan Data from 8360 Scanbox

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas – The 8360 ScanBox measures millions of points across aviation components and produces a 3D digital scan of parts in their real-world condition. This approach is a step forward for current operations that have historically depended on calipers, micrometers, or feeler gauges as the primary measurement tools. "It's going to make us faster and increase efficiencies," said Col. Joseph H. Parker, Corpus Christi Army Depot commander.
