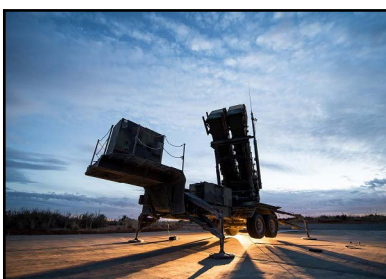

Romania strengthens alliance, homeland defense with Patriot

PORT OF CONSTANTA, Romania -- Romania has received its first shipment of the U.S. Patriot surface-to-air missile system. The shipment this month was part of a \$3.9 billion foreign military sale managed by the U.S. Army Security Assistance Command that will boost Romania's defensive capabilities and their military modernization plans. The Patriot and other FMS purchases, like the U.S.-made HIMARS and F-16 fighter jets, puts Romania in line to increase military spending to 2% of its GDP by 2024, the minimum amount required of NATO members.

ArMA to expand 'fence-to-fence' at Army installations

SAN ANTONIO – The Army Maintenance Activity, or ArMA, is expanding to all facilities across each of the 73 installations managed by Army Installation Management Command in 2022. Aligned with Army modernization efforts, ArMA digitizes the work order process for all Army-owned facilities with a centralized system for submission and tracking. "This is part of the Army operating in the information age – not just for housing but for all facilities on the installation, which is what we call fence-to-fence," said Doug Enfield, ArMA program manager.



Transitioning Soldiers find success through Army job program

FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo. – For many Soldiers, securing a successful career after serving in the Army starts with the opportunities they take advantage of as they begin to transition out of the military. One of the major resources that prepares Soldiers is the Army Career Skills Program. The program provides transitioning Soldiers the opportunity to participate in employment-skills training, on-the-job training, pre-apprenticeships and internships with a high probability of employment in high-demand and high-skilled jobs.



Fort Knox's primary water treatment plant resumes operations

FORT KNOX, Ky. – After being shut down in November 2020, Fort Knox's Muldraugh Water Treatment Plant is once again operational and treating water for the installation and the city of Muldraugh. Fort Knox Public Works Director Jason Root said the decision to conduct a \$15 million renovation to the plant was made out of necessity. "While workers have maintained the facility for the past 80 years through routine maintenance and spot repairs, it simply outlived its useful life and was not nearly as efficient as what we have now," Root said.

Modern traffic technology enhances mobility at Fort Benning

FORT BENNING, Ga. – Fort Benning Directorate of Public Works has deployed innovative traffic technology known as NaviGator to ease driver commute time and enhancing safety at Fort Benning. "We have about an average of 34,200 vehicles accessing the installation daily," said Jim Webster, Directorate of Emergency Services. NaviGator provides real-time speed, volume, and travel time data using closed-circuit television, video detection cameras, ramp meters and dynamic message signs.
