Army to increase housing pay for Soldiers

WASHINGTON – Soldiers and families paying unusually high living costs may qualify for a short-term increase in their housing allowance from October through December 2021, finance officials. To receive the payout, Soldiers in designated areas will need to apply through their unit S-1s and show they have incurred higher housing costs, said Larry Lock, chief of compensation and entitlements for the Army's G-1 office. Once approved, payouts should kick in within weeks, Lock added.



JBLM to privatize water, contracts with American Water

JOINT BASE LEWIS-McCHORD, Wash. – On Oct. 1, American Water, the nation's largest publicly traded water and wastewater utility company, will assume operations of Joint Base Lewis-McChord's water and waste water systems. The company was awarded a 50-year contract in September 2020, valued at \$771 million, to privatize the water and wastewater utilities at JBLM. With the addition of JBLM, American Water will cover 17 military bases across the country.



Meeting brings Central Texas educators, leaders to Fort Hood

FORT HOOD, Texas – Representatives of school districts within the Central Texas region met with installation leaders to discuss how the districts are serving military-affiliated students during the annual Schools Council Meeting in the Fort Hood Community Events Center here Sept. 16. Col. Chad R. Foster, commander of U.S. Army Garrison – Fort Hood, updated the school districts about the progress at Fort Hood. He said most of the units on the installation would actually be in Central Texas, instead of deployed, for the next 12-18 months.

Garrison's youth center facilitates care of middle and high school students

KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany – Finding care and activities for middle and high school students after school can be an uphill battle for parents, but U.S. Army Garrison Rheinland-Pfalz's two youth centers help bridge that gap. The program is free for middle- and high-school students, grades 6 to 12, to be involved in a wide range of programs.

CECOM presence at APG enters second decade

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – September 2021 marks the 10th anniversary of the closure of Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, ending its 94-year run as a military base. As part of the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure or BRAC process, what was then C4ISR moved 4,806 employee positions, 117 laboratories, and 100,000 pieces of equipment and furniture from Fort Monmouth to Aberdeen Proving Ground without interruption to its support to Soldiers.

Aviation readiness starts at Rucker
