

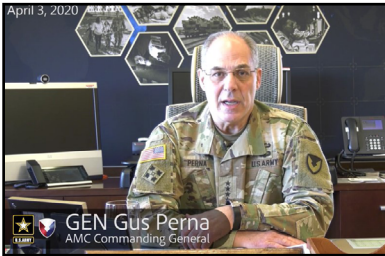

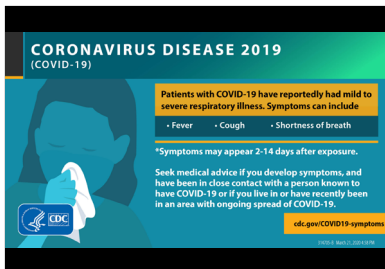
Winning Matters against COVID-19
