Defense Department's annual housing survey begins soon

WASHINGTON – W. Jordan Gillis, the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Sustainment and the Defense Department's Chief Housing Officer, is inviting Department of Defense housing residents to participate in the department's housing satisfaction survey. Each year, DOD surveys residents of government-owned, government-leased, or privatized family housing and current residents of privatized unaccompanied housing. The survey results will help inform plans for near-term and future improvements to housing, resident services and community amenities.

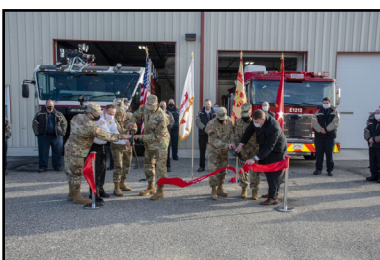
Tobyhanna provides critical logistics support to OWS
