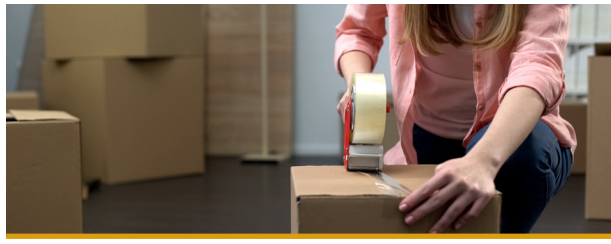

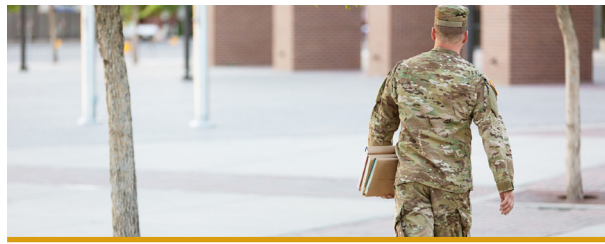
Army Emergency Relief (AER)

AER provides loans and grants to eligible Active Duty and Retired Service Members and their Families to assist with emergency financial needs. AER does provide services to Fort Hamilton Reserve Soldiers as an exception to policy when there is emergency need for travel assistance.



Relocation Readiness Program (RRP)

The RRP assists Soldiers and Families as they relocate to and from Fort Hamilton. RRP also provides resources and services to ensure a smooth settling in process.



Information, Referral and Follow Up Program (I&R)

The I&R program is the main source for integrated information on Fort Hamilton and the surrounding communities. I&R assesses each individual's situation and makes a referral to the appropriate military or civilian agency.

Survivor Outreach Services (SOS)

The mission of SOS is to provide emotional support, education on benefits and advocacy on issues facing surviving Families.



Family Advocacy Program (FAP)

FAP is dedicated to the prevention, education, prompt reporting and intervention of domestic violence and child abuse. FAP provides a variety of community-based educational opportunities for Soldiers and Families on parenting, anger/stress management and communication skills. Command and troop briefings are offered on the prevention of domestic violence/child abuse. Crisis intervention is available with referral to appropriate agencies. FAP provides victim advocacy (DAVA) services for domestic violence 24/7/365.

Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)
