

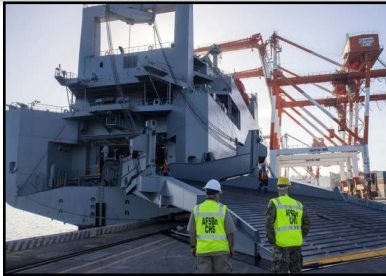

Sustainment Command unit successfully downloads APS-3

SUBIC BAY, Philippines – Army Field Support Battalion-Charleston successfully executed the download of the Army Prepositioned Stock 3, vessel for the first time in the Indo-Pacific Theater. APS-3, also known as APS Afloat, enables rapid power projection, enhances logistical support globally and sustains Soldiers as resources are shifted throughout the operational theater. The equipment aboard the APS-3 vessels is maintained and reset at the AFSBn-Charleston facilities located at Joint Base Charleston, South Carolina.



LOGCAP holds executive level summit at Rock Island Arsenal

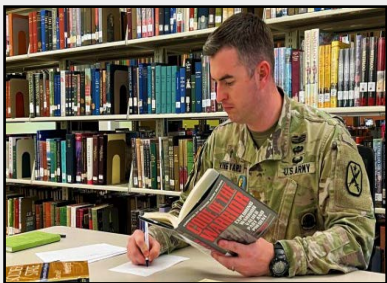
RIA Family Program changes name, embraces different families
